

ISAIAH 40

Observation Worksheet

Chapter Theme _____

“COMFORT, O comfort My people,” says your God.

2 “Speak kindly to Jerusalem;

And call out to her, that her warfare has ended,

That her iniquity has been removed,

That she has received of the LORD’s hand

Double for all her sins.”

3 A voice is calling,

“Clear the way for the LORD in the wilderness;

Make smooth in the desert a highway for our God.

4 “Let every valley be lifted up,

And every mountain and hill be made low;

And let the rough ground become a plain,

And the rugged terrain a broad valley;

5 Then the glory of the LORD will be revealed,

And all flesh will see *it* together;

For the mouth of the LORD has spoken.”

6 A voice says, “Call out.”

Then he answered, “What shall I call out?”

All flesh is grass, and all its loveliness is like the flower of the field.

7 The grass withers, the flower fades,

When the breath of the LORD blows upon it;

Surely the people are grass.

8 The grass withers, the flower fades,

But the word of our God stands forever.

9 Get yourself up on a high mountain,

O Zion, bearer of good news,

Lift up your voice mightily,

O Jerusalem, bearer of good news;

Lift *it* up, do not fear.

- Say to the cities of Judah,
“Here is your God!”
- 10 Behold, the Lord GOD will come with might,
With His arm ruling for Him.
Behold, His reward is with Him
And His recompense before Him.
- 11 Like a shepherd He will tend His flock,
In His arm He will gather the lambs
And carry *them* in His bosom;
He will gently lead the nursing *ewes*.
- 12 Who has measured the waters in the hollow of His hand,
And marked off the heavens by the span,
And calculated the dust of the earth by the measure,
And weighed the mountains in a balance
And the hills in a pair of scales?
- 13 Who has directed the Spirit of the LORD,
Or as His counselor has informed Him?
- 14 With whom did He consult and *who* gave Him understanding?
And *who* taught Him in the path of justice and taught Him knowledge
And informed Him of the way of understanding?
- 15 Behold, the nations are like a drop from a bucket,
And are regarded as a speck of dust on the scales;
Behold, He lifts up the islands like fine dust.
- 16 Even Lebanon is not enough to burn,
Nor its beasts enough for a burnt offering.
- 17 All the nations are as nothing before Him,
They are regarded by Him as less than nothing and meaningless.
- 18 To whom then will you liken God?
Or what likeness will you compare with Him?
- 19 *As for* the idol, a craftsman casts it,
A goldsmith plates it with gold,
And a silversmith *fashions* chains of silver.
- 20 He who is too impoverished for *such* an offering

- Selects a tree that does not rot;
He seeks out for himself a skillful craftsman
To prepare an idol that will not totter.
- 21 Do you not know? Have you not heard?
Has it not been declared to you from the beginning?
Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth?
- 22 It is He who sits above the circle of the earth,
And its inhabitants are like grasshoppers,
Who stretches out the heavens like a curtain
And spreads them out like a tent to dwell in.
- 23 He *it is* who reduces rulers to nothing,
Who makes the judges of the earth meaningless.
- 24 Scarcely have they been planted,
Scarcely have they been sown,
Scarcely has their stock taken root in the earth,
But He merely blows on them, and they wither,
And the storm carries them away like stubble.
- 25 “To whom then will you liken Me
That I would be *his* equal?” says the Holy One.
- 26 Lift up your eyes on high
And see who has created these *stars*,
The One who leads forth their host by number,
He calls them all by name;
Because of the greatness of His might and the strength of *His* power,
Not one *of them* is missing.
- 27 Why do you say, O Jacob, and assert, O Israel,
“My way is hidden from the LORD,
And the justice due me escapes the notice of my God”?
- 28 Do you not know? Have you not heard?
The Everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator of the ends of the earth
Does not become weary or tired.
His understanding is inscrutable.
- 29 He gives strength to the weary,
And to *him who* lacks might He increases power.

30 Though youths grow weary and tired,
 And vigorous young men stumble badly,
31 Yet those who wait for the LORD
 Will gain new strength;
 They will mount up *with* wings like eagles,
 They will run and not get tired,
 They will walk and not become weary.

ISAIAH 41

Chapter Theme _____

- “COASTLANDS, listen to Me in silence,
And let the peoples gain new strength;
Let them come forward, then let them speak;
Let us come together for judgment.
- 2 “Who has aroused one from the east
Whom He calls in righteousness to His feet?
He delivers up nations before him
And subdues kings.
He makes them like dust with his sword,
As the wind-driven chaff with his bow.
- 3 “He pursues them, passing on in safety,
By a way he had not been traversing with his feet.
- 4 “Who has performed and accomplished *it*,
Calling forth the generations from the beginning?
‘I, the LORD, am the first, and with the last. I am He.’ ”
- 5 The coastlands have seen and are afraid;
The ends of the earth tremble;
They have drawn near and have come.
- 6 Each one helps his neighbor
And says to his brother, “Be strong!”
- 7 So the craftsman encourages the smelter,
*And he who smooths metal with the hammer encourages him who beats the
anvil,*
Saying of the soldering, “It is good”;
And he fastens it with nails,
So that it will not totter.
- 8 “But you, Israel, My servant,
Jacob whom I have chosen,
Descendant of Abraham My friend,
- 9 You whom I have taken from the ends of the earth,

- And called from its remotest parts
And said to you, 'You are My servant,
I have chosen you and not rejected you.
- 10 'Do not fear, for I am with you;
Do not anxiously look about you, for I am your God.
I will strengthen you, surely I will help you,
Surely I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.'
- 11 "Behold, all those who are angered at you will be shamed and dishonored;
Those who contend with you will be as nothing and will perish.
- 12 "You will seek those who quarrel with you, but will not find them,
Those who war with you will be as nothing and non-existent.
- 13 "For I am the LORD your God, who upholds your right hand,
Who says to you, 'Do not fear, I will help you.'
- 14 "Do not fear, you worm Jacob, you men of Israel;
I will help you," declares the LORD, "and your Redeemer is the Holy One of
Israel.
- 15 "Behold, I have made you a new, sharp threshing sledge with double edges;
You will thresh the mountains and pulverize *them*,
And will make the hills like chaff.
- 16 "You will winnow them, and the wind will carry them away,
And the storm will scatter them;
But you will rejoice in the LORD,
You will glory in the Holy One of Israel.
- 17 "The afflicted and needy are seeking water, but there is none,
And their tongue is parched with thirst;
I, the LORD, will answer them Myself,
As the God of Israel I will not forsake them.
- 18 "I will open rivers on the bare heights
And springs in the midst of the valleys;
I will make the wilderness a pool of water
And the dry land fountains of water.
- 19 "I will put the cedar in the wilderness,
The acacia and the myrtle and the olive tree;
I will place the juniper in the desert
Together with the box tree and the cypress,
- 20 That they may see and recognize,

- And consider and gain insight as well,
That the hand of the LORD has done this,
And the Holy One of Israel has created it.
- 21 “Present your case,” the LORD says.
“Bring forward your strong *arguments*,”
The King of Jacob says.
- 22 Let them bring forth and declare to us what is going to take place;
As for the former *events*, declare what they *were*,
That we may consider them and know their outcome.
Or announce to us what is coming;
- 23 Declare the things that are going to come afterward,
That we may know that you are gods;
Indeed, do good or evil, that we may anxiously look about us and fear together.
- 24 Behold, you are of no account,
And your work amounts to nothing;
He who chooses you is an abomination.
- 25 “I have aroused one from the north, and he has come;
From the rising of the sun he will call on My name;
And he will come upon rulers as *upon* mortar,
Even as the potter treads clay.”
- 26 Who has declared *this* from the beginning, that we might know?
Or from former times, that we may say, “*He is right!*”?
Surely there was no one who declared,
Surely there was no one who proclaimed,
Surely there was no one who heard your words.
- 27 “Formerly *I said* to Zion, ‘Behold, here they are.’
And to Jerusalem, ‘I will give a messenger of good news.’
- 28 “But when I look, there is no one,
And there is no counselor among them
Who, if I ask, can give an answer.
- 29 “Behold, all of them are false;
Their works are worthless,
Their molten images are wind and emptiness.

ISAIAH 42

- “BEHOLD, My Servant, whom I uphold;
My chosen one *in whom* My soul delights.
I have put My Spirit upon Him;
He will bring forth justice to the nations.
- 2 “He will not cry out or raise *His voice*,
Nor make His voice heard in the street.
- 3 “A bruised reed He will not break
And a dimly burning wick He will not extinguish;
He will faithfully bring forth justice.
- 4 “He will not be disheartened or crushed
Until He has established justice in the earth;
And the coastlands will wait expectantly for His law.”
- 5 Thus says God the LORD,
Who created the heavens and stretched them out,
Who spread out the earth and its offspring,
Who gives breath to the people on it
And spirit to those who walk in it,
- 6 “I am the LORD, I have called you in righteousness,
I will also hold you by the hand and watch over you,
And I will appoint you as a covenant to the people,
As a light to the nations,
- 7 To open blind eyes,
To bring out prisoners from the dungeon
And those who dwell in darkness from the prison.
- 8 “I am the LORD, that is My name;
I will not give My glory to another,
Nor My praise to graven images.
- 9 “Behold, the former things have come to pass,
Now I declare new things;
Before they spring forth I proclaim *them* to you.”

- 10 Sing to the LORD a new song,
Sing His praise from the end of the earth!
You who go down to the sea, and all that is in it.
You islands, and those who dwell on them.
- 11 Let the wilderness and its cities lift up *their voices*,
The settlements where Kedar inhabits.
Let the inhabitants of Sela sing aloud,
Let them shout for joy from the tops of the mountains.
- 12 Let them give glory to the LORD
And declare His praise in the coastlands.
- 13 The LORD will go forth like a warrior,
He will arouse *His* zeal like a man of war.
He will utter a shout, yes, He will raise a war cry.
He will prevail against His enemies.
- 14 “I have kept silent for a long time,
I have kept still and restrained Myself.
Now like a woman in labor I will groan,
I will both gasp and pant.
- 15 “I will lay waste the mountains and hills
And wither all their vegetation;
I will make the rivers into coastlands
And dry up the ponds.
- 16 “I will lead the blind by a way they do not know,
In paths they do not know I will guide them.
I will make darkness into light before them
And rugged places into plains.
These are the things I will do,
And I will not leave them undone.”
- 17 They will be turned back *and* be utterly put to shame,
Who trust in idols,
Who say to molten images,
“You are our gods.”
- 18 Hear, you deaf!
And look, you blind, that you may see.
- 19 Who is blind but My servant,
Or so deaf as My messenger whom I send?

Who is so blind as he that is at peace *with Me*,
Or so blind as the servant of the LORD?
20 You have seen many things, but you do not observe *them*;
Your ears are open, but none hears.
21 The LORD was pleased for His righteousness' sake
To make the law great and glorious.
22 But this is a people plundered and despoiled;
All of them are trapped in caves,
Or are hidden away in prisons;
They have become a prey with none to deliver *them*,
And a spoil, with none to say, "Give *them* back!"
23 Who among you will give ear to this?
Who will give heed and listen hereafter?
24 Who gave Jacob up for spoil, and Israel to plunderers?
Was it not the LORD, against whom we have sinned,
And in whose ways they were not willing to walk,
And whose law they did not obey?
25 So He poured out on him the heat of His anger
And the fierceness of battle;
And it set him aflame all around,
Yet he did not recognize *it*;
And it burned him, but he paid no attention.

ISAIAH 43

- BUT now, thus says the LORD, your Creator, O Jacob,
And He who formed you, O Israel,
“Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have called you by name; you are Mine!
- 2 “When you pass through the waters, I will be with you;
And through the rivers, they will not overflow you.
When you walk through the fire, you will not be scorched,
Nor will the flame burn you.
- 3 “For I am the LORD your God,
The Holy One of Israel, your Savior;
I have given Egypt as your ransom,
Cush and Seba in your place.
- 4 “Since you are precious in My sight,
Since you are honored and I love you,
I will give *other* men in your place and *other* peoples in exchange for your life.
- 5 “Do not fear, for I am with you;
I will bring your offspring from the east,
And gather you from the west.
- 6 “I will say to the north, ‘Give *them* up!’
And to the south, ‘Do not hold *them* back.’
Bring My sons from afar
And My daughters from the ends of the earth,
- 7 Everyone who is called by My name,
And whom I have created for My glory,
Whom I have formed, even whom I have made.”
- 8 Bring out the people who are blind, even though they have eyes,
And the deaf, even though they have ears.
- 9 All the nations have gathered together
So that the peoples may be assembled.

- Who among them can declare this
And proclaim to us the former things?
Let them present their witnesses that they may be justified,
Or let them hear and say, "It is true."
- 10 "You are My witnesses," declares the LORD,
"And My servant whom I have chosen,
So that you may know and believe Me
And understand that I am He.
Before Me there was no God formed,
And there will be none after Me.
- 11 "I, even I, am the LORD,
And there is no savior besides Me.
- 12 "It is I who have declared and saved and proclaimed,
And there was no strange *god* among you;
So you are My witnesses," declares the LORD,
"And I am God.
- 13 "Even from eternity I am He,
And there is none who can deliver out of My hand;
I act and who can reverse it?"
- 14 Thus says the LORD your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel,
"For your sake I have sent to Babylon,
And will bring them all down as fugitives,
Even the Chaldeans, into the ships in which they rejoice.
- 15 "I am the LORD, your Holy One,
The Creator of Israel, your King."
- 16 Thus says the LORD,
Who makes a way through the sea
And a path through the mighty waters,
17 Who brings forth the chariot and the horse,
The army and the mighty man
(They will lie down together *and* not rise again;
They have been quenched *and* extinguished like a wick):
- 18 "Do not call to mind the former things,
Or ponder things of the past.
- 19 "Behold, I will do something new,
Now it will spring forth;

- Will you not be aware of it?
I will even make a roadway in the wilderness,
Rivers in the desert.
- 20 “The beasts of the field will glorify Me,
The jackals and the ostriches,
Because I have given waters in the wilderness
And rivers in the desert,
To give drink to My chosen people.
- 21 “The people whom I formed for Myself
Will declare My praise.
- 22 “Yet you have not called on Me, O Jacob;
But you have become weary of Me, O Israel.
- 23 “You have not brought to Me the sheep of your burnt offerings,
Nor have you honored Me with your sacrifices.
I have not burdened you with offerings,
Nor wearied you with incense.
- 24 “You have bought Me not sweet cane with money,
Nor have you filled Me with the fat of your sacrifices;
Rather you have burdened Me with your sins,
You have wearied Me with your iniquities.
- 25 “I, even I, am the one who wipes out your transgressions for My own sake,
And I will not remember your sins.
- 26 “Put Me in remembrance, let us argue our case together;
State your *cause*, that you may be proved right.
- 27 “Your first forefather sinned,
And your spokesmen have transgressed against Me.
- 28 “So I will pollute the princes of the sanctuary,
And I will consign Jacob to the ban and Israel to revilement.

ISAIAH 44

Chapter Theme _____

- “BUT now listen, O Jacob, My servant,
And Israel, whom I have chosen:
- 2 Thus says the LORD who made you
And formed you from the womb, who will help you,
‘Do not fear, O Jacob My servant;
And you Jeshurun whom I have chosen.
- 3 ‘For I will pour out water on the thirsty *land*
And streams on the dry ground;
I will pour out My Spirit on your offspring
And My blessing on your descendants;
- 4 And they will spring up among the grass
Like poplars by streams of water.’
- 5 “This one will say, ‘I am the LORD’S’;
And that one will call on the name of Jacob;
And another will write *on* his hand, ‘Belonging to the LORD,’
And will name Israel’s name with honor.
- 6 “Thus says the LORD, the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the LORD of hosts:
‘I am the first and I am the last,
And there is no God besides Me.
- 7 ‘Who is like Me? Let him proclaim and declare it;
Yes, let him recount it to Me in order,
From the time that I established the ancient nation.
And let them declare to them the things that are coming
And the events that are going to take place.
- 8 ‘Do not tremble and do not be afraid;
Have I not long since announced *it* to you and declared *it*?
And you are My witnesses.
Is there any God besides Me,
Or is there any *other* Rock?
I know of none.’ ”

- 9 Those who fashion a graven image are all of them futile, and their precious things are of no profit; even their own witnesses fail to see or know, so that they will be put to shame.
- 10 Who has fashioned a god or cast an idol to no profit?
- 11 Behold, all his companions will be put to shame, for the craftsmen themselves are mere men. Let them all assemble themselves, let them stand up, let them tremble, let them together be put to shame.
- 12 The man shapes iron into a cutting tool and does his work over the coals, fashioning it with hammers and working it with his strong arm. He also gets hungry and his strength fails; he drinks no water and becomes weary.
- 13 *Another* shapes wood, he extends a measuring line; he outlines it with red chalk. He works it with planes and outlines it with a compass, and makes it like the form of a man, like the beauty of man, so that it may sit in a house.
- 14 Surely he cuts cedars for himself, and takes a cypress or an oak and raises *it* for himself among the trees of the forest. He plants a fir, and the rain makes it grow.
- 15 Then it becomes *something* for a man to burn, so he takes one of them and warms himself; he also makes a fire to bake bread. He also makes a god and worships it; he makes it a graven image and falls down before it.
- 16 Half of it he burns in the fire; over *this* half he eats meat as he roasts a roast and is satisfied. He also warms himself and says, "Aha! I am warm, I have seen the fire."
- 17 But the rest of it he makes into a god, his graven image. He falls down before it and worships; he also prays to it and says, "Deliver me, for you are my god."
- 18 They do not know, nor do they understand, for He has smeared over their eyes so that they cannot see and their hearts so that they cannot comprehend.
- 19 No one recalls, nor is there knowledge or understanding to say, "I have burned half of it in the fire and also have baked bread over its coals. I roast meat and eat *it*. Then I make the rest of it into an abomination, I fall down before a block of wood!"
- 20 He feeds on ashes; a deceived heart has turned him aside. And he cannot deliver himself, nor say, "Is there not a lie in my right hand?"
- 21 "Remember these things, O Jacob,
And Israel, for you are My servant;
I have formed you, you are My servant,
O Israel, you will not be forgotten by Me.
- 22 "I have wiped out your transgressions like a thick cloud

- And your sins like a heavy mist.
Return to Me, for I have redeemed you.”
- 23 Shout for joy, O heavens, for the LORD has done *it!*
Shout joyfully, you lower parts of the earth;
Break forth into a shout of joy, you mountains,
O forest, and every tree in it;
For the LORD has redeemed Jacob
And in Israel He shows forth His glory.
- 24 Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, and the one who formed you from the
womb,
“I, the LORD, am the maker of all things,
Stretching out the heavens by Myself
And spreading out the earth all alone,
25 Causing the omens of boasters to fail,
Making fools out of diviners,
Causing wise men to draw back
And turning their knowledge into foolishness,
26 Confirming the word of His servant
And performing the purpose of His messengers.
It is I who says of Jerusalem, ‘She shall be inhabited!’
And of the cities of Judah, ‘They shall be built.’
And I will raise up her ruins *again*.
- 27 “*It is I* who says to the depth of the sea, ‘Be dried up!’
And I will make your rivers dry.
- 28 “*It is I* who says of Cyrus, ‘*He is My shepherd!*
And he will perform all My desire.’
And he declares of Jerusalem, ‘She will be built,’
And of the temple, ‘Your foundation will be laid.’ ”

ISAIAH 45

- THUS says the LORD to Cyrus His anointed,
Whom I have taken by the right hand,
To subdue nations before him
And to loose the loins of kings;
To open doors before him so that gates will not be shut:
- 2 “I will go before you and make the rough places smooth;
I will shatter the doors of bronze and cut through their iron bars.
- 3 “I will give you the treasures of darkness
And hidden wealth of secret places,
So that you may know that it is I,
The LORD, the God of Israel, who calls you by your name.
- 4 “For the sake of Jacob My servant,
And Israel My chosen *one*,
I have also called you by your name;
I have given you a title of honor
Though you have not known Me.
- 5 “I am the LORD, and there is no other;
Besides Me there is no God.
I will gird you, though you have not known Me;
- 6 That men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun
That there is no one besides Me.
I am the LORD, and there is no other,
- 7 The One forming light and creating darkness,
Causing well-being and creating calamity;
I am the LORD who does all these.
- 8 “Drip down, O heavens, from above,
And let the clouds pour down righteousness;
Let the earth open up and salvation bear fruit,
And righteousness spring up with it.
I, the LORD, have created it.

- 9 “Woe to *the one* who quarrels with his Maker—
An earthenware vessel among the vessels of earth!
Will the clay say to the potter, ‘What are you doing?’
Or the thing you are making *says*, ‘He has no hands?’
- 10 “Woe to him who says to a father, ‘What are you begetting?’
Or to a woman, ‘To what are you giving birth?’ ”
- 11 Thus says the LORD, the Holy One of Israel, and his Maker:
“Ask Me about the things to come concerning My sons,
And you shall commit to Me the work of My hands.
- 12 “It is I who made the earth, and created man upon it.
I stretched out the heavens with My hands
And I ordained all their host.
- 13 “I have aroused him in righteousness
And I will make all his ways smooth;
He will build My city and will let My exiles go free,
Without any payment or reward,” says the LORD of hosts.
- 14 Thus says the LORD,
“The products of Egypt and the merchandise of Cush
And the Sabeans, men of stature,
Will come over to you and will be yours;
They will walk behind you, they will come over in chains
And will bow down to you;
They will make supplication to you:
‘Surely, God is with you, and there is none else,
No other God.’ ”
- 15 Truly, You are a God who hides Himself,
O God of Israel, Savior!
- 16 They will be put to shame and even humiliated, all of them;
The manufacturers of idols will go away together in humiliation.
- 17 Israel has been saved by the LORD
With an everlasting salvation;
You will not be put to shame or humiliated
To all eternity.
- 18 For thus says the LORD, who created the heavens (He is the God who formed the
earth and made it, He established it *and* did not create it a waste place, *but* formed
it to be inhabited),

- “I am the LORD, and there is none else.
- 19 “I have not spoken in secret,
In some dark land;
I did not say to the offspring of Jacob,
‘Seek Me in a waste place’;
I, the LORD, speak righteousness,
Declaring things that are upright.
- 20 “Gather yourselves and come;
Draw near together, you fugitives of the nations;
They have no knowledge,
Who carry about their wooden idol
And pray to a god who cannot save.
- 21 “Declare and set forth *your case*;
Indeed, let them consult together.
Who has announced this from of old?
Who has long since declared it?
Is it not I, the LORD?
And there is no other God besides Me,
A righteous God and a Savior;
There is none except Me.
- 22 “Turn to Me and be saved, all the ends of the earth;
For I am God, and there is no other.
- 23 “I have sworn by Myself,
The word has gone forth from My mouth in righteousness
And will not turn back,
That to Me every knee will bow, every tongue will swear *allegiance*.
- 24 “They will say of Me, ‘Only in the LORD are righteousness and strength.’
Men will come to Him,
And all who were angry at Him will be put to shame.
- 25 “In the LORD all the offspring of Israel
Will be justified and will glory.”

ISAIAH 46

BEL has bowed down, Nebo stoops over;

Their images are *consigned* to the beasts and the cattle.

The things that you carry are burdensome,

A load for the weary *beast*.

2 They stooped over, they have bowed down together;

They could not rescue the burden,

But have themselves gone into captivity.

3 “Listen to Me, O house of Jacob,

And all the remnant of the house of Israel,

You who have been borne by Me from birth

And have been carried from the womb;

4 Even to *your* old age I will be the same,

And even to *your* graying years I will bear *you!*

I have done *it*, and I will carry *you*;

And I will bear *you* and I will deliver *you*.

5 “To whom would you liken Me

And make Me equal and compare Me,

That we would be alike?

6 “Those who lavish gold from the purse

And weigh silver on the scale

Hire a goldsmith, and he makes it *into* a god;

They bow down, indeed they worship it.

7 “They lift it upon the shoulder *and* carry it;

They set it in its place and it stands *there*.

It does not move from its place.

Though one may cry to it, it cannot answer;

It cannot deliver him from his distress.

8 “Remember this, and be assured;

Recall it to mind, you transgressors.

9 “Remember the former things long past,

- For I am God, and there is no other;
I am God, and there is no one like Me,
- 10 Declaring the end from the beginning,
And from ancient times things which have not been done,
Saying, 'My purpose will be established,
And I will accomplish all My good pleasure';

- 12 "Listen to Me, you stubborn-minded,
Who are far from righteousness.
- 13 "I bring near My righteousness, it is not far off;
And My salvation will not delay.
And I will grant salvation in Zion,
And My glory for Israel.

All you beasts in the forest,

- 10 His watchmen are blind,
All of them know nothing.
All of them are mute dogs unable to bark,
Dreamers lying down, who love to slumber;
- 11 And the dogs are greedy, they are not satisfied.
And they are shepherds who have no understanding;
They have all turned to their own way,
Each one to his unjust gain, to the last one.
- 12 “Come,” *they say*, “let us get wine, and let us drink heavily of strong drink;
And tomorrow will be like today, only more so.”

You found renewed strength,
Therefore you did not faint.
- 11 “Of whom were you worried and fearful
When you lied, and did not remember Me
Nor give *Me* a thought?
Was I not silent even for a long time
So you do not fear Me?
- 12 “I will declare your righteousness and your deeds,
But they will not profit you.
- 13 “When you cry out, let your collection of *idols* deliver you.
But the wind will carry all of them up,
And a breath will take *them* away.
But he who takes refuge in Me will inherit the land
And will possess My holy mountain.”
- 14 And it will be said,
“Build up, build up, prepare the way,
Remove *every* obstacle out of the way of My people.”
- 15 For thus says the high and exalted One
Who lives forever, whose name is Holy,
“I dwell *on* a high and holy place,
And *also* with the contrite and lowly of spirit
In order to revive the spirit of the lowly
And to revive the heart of the contrite.
- 16 “For I will not contend forever,
Nor will I always be angry;
For the spirit would grow faint before Me,

6 “A voice of uproar from the city, a voice from the temple,

The voice of the LORD who is rendering recompense to His enemies.

7 “Before she travailed, she brought forth;

Before her pain came, she gave birth to a boy.

8 “Who has heard such a thing? Who has seen such things?

Can a land be born in one day?

- Can a nation be brought forth all at once?
As soon as Zion travailed, she also brought forth her sons.
- 9 “Shall I bring to the point of birth and not give delivery?” says the LORD.
“Or shall I who gives delivery shut *the womb?*” says your God.
- 10 “Be joyful with Jerusalem and rejoice for her, all you who love her;
Be exceedingly glad with her, all you who mourn over her,
11 That you may nurse and be satisfied with her comforting breasts,
That you may suck and be delighted with her bountiful bosom.”
- 12 For thus says the LORD, “Behold, I extend peace to her like a river,
And the glory of the nations like an overflowing stream;
And you will be nursed, you will be carried on the hip and fondled on the
knees.
- 13 “As one whom his mother comforts, so I will comfort you;
And you will be comforted in Jerusalem.”
- 14 Then you will see *this*, and your heart will be glad,
And your bones will flourish like the new grass;
And the hand of the LORD will be made known to His servants,
But He will be indignant toward His enemies.
- 15 For behold, the LORD will come in fire
And His chariots like the whirlwind,
To render His anger with fury,
And His rebuke with flames of fire.
- 16 For the LORD will execute judgment by fire
And by His sword on all flesh,
And those slain by the LORD will be many.
- 17 “Those who sanctify and purify themselves *to go* to the gardens,
Following one in the center,
Who eat swine’s flesh, detestable things and mice,
Will come to an end altogether,” declares the LORD.
- 18 “For I know their works and their thoughts; the time is coming to gather all
nations and tongues. And they shall come and see My glory.
- 19 “I will set a sign among them and will send survivors from them to the nations:
Tarshish, Put, Lud, Meshech, Tubal and Javan, to the distant coastlands that have
neither heard My fame nor seen My glory. And they will declare My glory among
the nations.

- 20 “Then they shall bring all your brethren from all the nations as a grain offering to the LORD, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules and on camels, to My holy mountain Jerusalem,” says the LORD, “just as the sons of Israel bring their grain offering in a clean vessel to the house of the LORD.
- 21 “I will also take some of them for priests *and* for Levites,” says the LORD.
- 22 “For just as the new heavens and the new earth
Which I make will endure before Me,” declares the LORD,
“So your offspring and your name will endure.
- 23 “And it shall be from new moon to new moon
And from sabbath to sabbath,
All mankind will come to bow down before Me,” says the LORD.
- 24 “Then they will go forth and look
On the corpses of the men
Who have transgressed against Me.
For their worm will not die
And their fire will not be quenched;
And they will be an abhorrence to all mankind.”
